

HOUSE BILL SUMMARY

The 95th General Assembly – Second Regular Session

The following bills impacting county government have been introduced as of February 15th. A comprehensive list will be provided at monthly board meetings.

HB 1203 - Kuessner - Requires an inmate receiving on-site medical examination or treatment from any correctional facility's medical personnel to be assessed 25 cents per visit

HB 1206 - Gatschenberger - Lowers the age at which a person can obtain a concealed carry endorsement from 23 to 21 years of age and increases the period of time an endorsement is valid from three years to five years

HB 1207 - Day - Classifies sawmills and planing mills as agricultural and horticultural property instead of commercial property for property taxation purposes

HB 1210 - Lipke - Changes the controlled substance classification of all methamphetamine precursor drugs from Schedule IV and Schedule V to Schedule III, requiring a physician's prescription

HB 1214 - Dusenberg - Exempts from real property taxes certain eligible taxpayers 75 years of age and older with certain income levels

HB 1216 - Dusenberg - Exempts real property owned by individuals 65 years of age and older from increases in the tax rate and assessed valuation until the owner moves, sells the property, or fails to notify of continued eligibility

HB 1222 - Smith - Authorizes a sales tax exemption for membership fees and dues paid to any health or fitness club or facility

HB 1228 - Kraus - Exempts real property owned by individuals 65 years of age or older with certain levels of income from increases in assessed valuation that are not from new construction or improvements

HB 1229 - Kraus - Specifies that any fine collected for a red light violation by an entity utilizing an automated photo red light enforcement system must be given to the local school district where the infraction occurred

HB 1234 - Davis - Changes the laws regarding the filing fees for marriage licenses, dissolutions of marriage or legal separation, and judgments of certain dissolutions involving a child younger than 21 years of age

HB 1239 - Davis - Increases the period of time a concealed carry endorsement is valid from three years to five years from the date of issuance or renewal

HB 1242 - Sater - Requires the State Highway Patrol to make available for public inquiry a registry of certain drug offenders and law enforcement to notify DNR for cleanup of hazardous substances found in investigations

HB 1244 - Sater - Authorizes a state and local sales and use tax exemption for over-the-counter or nonprescription drugs which are prescribed by a practitioner

HB 1254 - Wilson - Allows rural empowerment zones to exist in any county with 20,000 or fewer residents but prohibits more than one rural empowerment zone in any county

HB 1261 - Komo - Allows political subdivisions to replace any property taxes levied for funding the political subdivision with a sales tax

HB 1263 - Komo - Allows specified sewer districts in a charter county to subdivide into subdistricts, issue bonds, collect annual rental charges, and construct and finance certain additional lateral sewers

HB 1267 - Meiners - Increases from \$3 to \$10 the fee charged by the county recorder of deeds for certain recorded documents pertaining to real property

HB 1272 - Bruns - Increases the rate that all counties and certain cities are authorized to impose, upon voter approval, or a transient guest tax on each occupied room, per night from up to 5 percent to up to 7 percent

HB 1278 - Roorda - Allows for the appointment of an acting county municipal court judge on a temporary basis if any judge of a county municipal court becomes ill or is otherwise unavailable

HB 1279 - Roorda - Requires the juvenile court to publish the time, date, and location of certain juvenile court proceedings in a court docket and to post it in a conspicuous and readily available location in the courthouse

HB 1281 - Roorda - Authorizes counties to assess a fee on all civil case filings by the circuit court to provide funding to qualified nonprofit organizations to implement a neutral site child custody exchange program

HB 1283 - Roorda - Requires the removal of all emergency lights, sirens, and decals designating a vehicle as an emergency vehicle prior to selling or consigning the vehicle unless it is sold to another safety agency

HB 1285 – Roorda - Requires all counties and fire protection districts to adopt and enforce the 2003 ICC International Fire Code

HB 1290 - Gatschenberger - Increases the minimum value of county property that the auditor in a charter county must annually inventory

HB 1291 - Burlison - Increases the period of time a concealed carry endorsement is valid from three years to five years from the date of issuance or renewal

HB 1299 - Lampe - Changes the laws regarding the Open Meetings and Records Law.

HB 1303 - Schaaf - Adds the counties of Andrew and Buchanan to the list of counties authorized to enact nuisance abatement ordinances regarding the condition of real property

HB 1308 - Hodges - Adds prosecuting attorneys, assistant prosecuting attorneys, circuit attorneys, and assistant circuit attorneys to the list of individuals who are exempt from certain concealed carry permit requirements

HB 1316 - Deeken - Changes the required notice that certain assessors must give taxpayers when the assessed valuation on real property increases

HB 1317 - Curls - Increases from \$3 to \$5 the fee charged by the county recorder of deeds for certain recorded documents pertaining to real property

HB 1321 - Parson - Authorizes a percentage reduction in real and personal property taxes for certain property owners 70 years of age or older

HB 1322 - LeVota - Changes the laws regarding campaign contributions to candidates and committees

HB 1326 - Bringer - Changes the laws regarding campaign contributions to candidates and committees

HB 1331 - Roorda - Changes the controlled substance classification of all methamphetamine precursor drugs from Schedule IV and Schedule V to Schedule III, requiring a physician's prescription

HB 1337 - Dusenberg - Changes the laws regarding campaign contributions to candidates and committees

HB 1340 - Dugger - Repeals the authorization for a sales tax of up to 1 percent for operation costs with a specified annual reduction of the property tax levy for fire protection districts in Douglas County

HB 1344 - Dugger - Changes the laws regarding the assessment and collection of volunteer fire protection association fees in Douglas County

HB 1350 - Ruestman - Changes the laws regarding assessed valuation of residential real property

HB 1352 - Schad - Increases the period of time a concealed carry endorsement is valid from three years to five years from the date of issuance or renewal

HB 1356 - Chappelle-Nadal - Prohibits a public body from entering into a public works contract with a company that has been found guilty of conducting discriminatory employment practices within the preceding five years

HB 1361 - Komo - Allows, upon voter approval, political subdivisions to replace any personal property taxes levied for funding the political subdivision with a revenue-neutral increase in the local sales tax

HB 1371 - Roorda - Allows an employee of a fire protection or ambulance district to serve as a board member of a fire protection or ambulance district if the district is not in the same county where he or she is employed

HB 1380 - Salva - Requires Jackson County to create a jury service expense fund to increase juror compensation to be funded by a \$3 surcharge which is to be assessed in certain circuit court proceedings in the county

HB 1381 - Smith - Prohibits a person from operating a motor vehicle on public property while using a wireless telephone with certain exceptions

HB 1384 - Nolte - Changes when tax statements must be mailed in all counties of the first classification from 30 days to 45 days before the delinquent date

HB 1385 - Nolte - Removes the requirement that certain presiding county commissioners be paid \$2,000 more than other county commissioners

HB 1386 - Nolte - Limits the increase in assessed valuation of residential property by the percentage of increase in Social Security benefits for the elderly and disabled who own and live in their principal residence

HB 1387 - Gatschenberger - Establishes the Firearms and Ammunition Sales Tax Holiday

HB 1388 - Day - Authorizes the City of Waynesville to impose, upon voter approval, a transient guest tax to be used for economic development initiatives for a multipurpose conference and convention center

HB 1392 - Kirkton - Changes the deadline from September 1 to October 1 for collectors in charter counties and the City of St. Louis to set ad valorem property tax rates

HB 1394 - Kirkton - Authorizes public library districts to impose, upon voter approval, a sales tax for the operation and maintenance of public libraries within the district

HB 1396 - Roorda - Establishes a procedure for residents of third class cities to petition the county council for the adoption or repeal of a city ordinance

HB 1397 - Roorda - Changes the laws regarding the county special allocation fund

HB 1403 - Cox - Establishes the Andrew Jackson Vote Restoration Act which requires certain elections to be held even if the number of candidates filing for a position is equal to the number of positions available

HB 1414 - McGhee - Specifies that any elected or appointed official of the state or a political subdivision who is found guilty or pleads guilty to a felony must immediately forfeit all his or her benefits

HB 1418 - Fallert - Allows an employee who is injured on the job to select his or her own health care provider to cure and relieve the effects of the injury at the expense of the employer

HB 1420 - Franz - Changes the laws regarding the sale of real property for the collection of delinquent taxes

HB 1421 - Franz - Lowers the age limit for juvenile court jurisdiction for state or local traffic violations from 15 1/2 to 15 years of age

HB 1422 - Franz - Allows money from the county law enforcement restitution fund to be used for county inmate work and service programs and limits the amount a county can assess an individual for certain offenses to \$10

HB 1424 - Franz - Changes the laws regarding the collection of property taxes

HB 1431 - Flook - Prohibits political subdivisions and public school districts from using tax revenue or school funds to purchase alcohol

HB 1432 - Flook - Changes the laws regarding port authorities and allows port authority boards to establish port improvement districts to fund certain projects with voter-approved sales taxes or property taxes

HB 1434 - Flook - Changes provisions relating to ethics

HB 1441 - Kuessner - Allows only an in-state entity to circulate a referendum or initiative petition and requires the entity to register with the Secretary of State at least one year prior to circulating any petition

HB 1444 - Jones (Timothy) - Requires certain public governing bodies to hold a public meeting and to allow public comment four business days prior to voting on certain issues

HB 1445 - Jones (Timothy) - Changes the laws regarding the Open Meetings and Records Law. Among its provisions, it requires information to be made available in an electronic format if a public body keeps records in an electronic format; it increases the maximum penalty for a purposeful violation of Secs. 610.010-610.026, RSMo, from up to \$5,000 to up to \$8,000 and the penalty for a knowingly violation from up to \$1,000 to \$1,000; it requires the governing body of any city, county, town, village or any entity created by these political subdivisions to hold a public meeting and to allow public comment five business days prior to voting on an issue involving fee or tax increases, eminent domain, zoning, transportation development districts, capital improvement districts, commercial improvement districts, or tax increment financing; it specifies that in any legal proceeding, there will be a presumption that a meeting, record, or vote is open to the public -- the burden to prove that it should be closed is on the public governmental body; and it requires any elected or appointed official, or their designated public information coordinator, who is a member of a public governmental body subject to the Sunshine Law to complete a training course offered by the Office of the Attorney General (at no cost) regarding the responsibilities of the body and its members on the Open Meetings Law.

HB 1451 - Lipke - Requires certain restitution to be paid through the office of the prosecuting or circuit attorney and requires the assessment of an administrative handling cost and an installment cost

HB 1453 - Lipke - Adds certain elected prosecutors or assistant prosecutors to the list of individuals who are exempt from certain restrictions on the use of weapons including the prohibition on carrying concealed weapons

HB 1458 - Thompson - Exempts motor fuel used to operate school buses transporting students for educational purposes from the motor fuel tax

HB 1460 - Hodges - Prohibits reductions in county officials' salaries when a county changes classifications until the current official leaves office

HB 1466 - Smith - Changes the laws regarding the oversight of public funds

HB 1468 - Brandom - Creates the Missouri Catastrophe Fund to help protect property and casualty insurers against insolvencies caused by earthquakes

HB 1469 - Wallace - Exempts motor fuel used to operate school buses transporting students for educational purposes from the motor fuel tax and requires a uniform and simplified motor fuel tax exemption claim process

HB 1470 - Frame - Allows voters to cast advance ballots

HB 1471 - Scavuzzo - Authorizes the City of Peculiar to impose, upon voter approval, a sales tax of up to 0.5 percent for the operation of public safety departments

HB 1486 - Gatschenberger - Authorizes each party to an appeal before the State Tax Commission to request one change of the assigned hearing officer by filing a written application

HB 1487 - Tilley - Changes the laws regarding ethics

HB 1488 - Jones - Changes the laws regarding unlawful discriminatory practices in employment as they relate to the Missouri Human Rights Law and the Workers' Compensation Law

HB 1490 - McGhee - Prohibits the Secretary of State from approving certain electronic voting systems and specifies that the official ballot must be a paper ballot

HB 1492 - Harris - Authorizes Jefferson County, upon voter approval, to impose a retail sales tax to fund public health and safety projects and pro-

HB 1594 - Hobbs - Authorizes counties to use ballot language which indicates that a tax is an extension of an existing tax and not a new tax

HB 1596 - Pollock - Establishes the requirements to take real property by adverse possession

HB 1600 - Dusenberg - Allows certain paid police officers of a paid police department to be eligible for workers' compensation benefits for an injury due to psychological stress

HB 1606 - Sater - Authorizes a sales tax exemption for all-terrain vehicles used solely for agricultural purposes

HB 1612 - Molendorp - Increases the number of trustees on certain sewer district boards

HB 1618 - Storch - Exempts yoga studios from sales tax

HB 1621 - McNeil - Increases from \$14,300 to \$16,000 the minimum base used to calculate the senior citizens property tax credit, commonly known as circuit breaker

HB 1633 - Pollock - Requires a telecommunications company to provide caller location information in emergency situations

HB 1640 - Roorda - Allows for the appointment of an acting county municipal court judge on a temporary basis if any judge of a county municipal court becomes ill or is otherwise unavailable

HB 1643 - Brown - Authorizes the recorder of deeds in Jackson County to collect a \$1 donation in addition to the fees charged for marriage and birth records to assist homeless families in the county

HB 1646 - Cooper - Allows a first class county to establish a county court

HB 1647 - Cooper - Changes the classification of certain watercraft from personal property to residential property for property taxation purposes

HB 1655 - Schaaf - Prohibits all entities except individuals or committees from making campaign contributions or expenditures

HB 1663 - Roorda - Authorizes certain fire protection districts to convert property taxes for emergency services to be used for general revenue purposes if the county has an emergency services sales tax

HB 1664 - Wasson - Modifies how members of county highway commissions are compensated

HB 1665 - Corcoran - Allows adopted adults who are 18 years of age or older and adopted after Aug. 28, 2010, to receive a certified copy of his or her original unaltered birth certificate and adoption records

HB 1666 - Fischer - Requires law enforcement agencies to report intoxication-related traffic arrests to the Missouri state highway patrol's DWI tracking system

HB 1669 - Ruzicka - Lowers the minimum age requirement for a concealed carry endorsement from 23 to 21 years of age, extends its validity to five years and allows prosecutors to carry concealed weapons, including in courthouse

HB 1674 - Lipke - Requires law enforcement agencies to enter alcohol-related traffic arrests into the DWI tracking system

HB 1676 - Sutherland - Allows public administrators to file petitions to transfer cases to another county and allows the court to order ward transportation upon the petition of the public administrator

HB 1680 - Roorda - Prohibits third class cities from imposing storm water usage fees on property owned by any church, public school, nonprofit organization, or political subdivision

HB 1681 - Roorda - Allows ambulance districts to impose, upon voter approval, a sales tax in lieu of a property tax to fund the district

HB 1695 - Stevenson - Changes several provisions regarding driving while intoxicated

HB 1697 - Stevenson - specifies that a person will be guilty of driving while intoxicated if he or she operates a motor vehicle while in an intoxicated condition or while any amount of controlled substance is present in the person as measured in the person's blood or urine.

HB 1699 - Stevenson - Revises the definition of "public record" as it relates to the Open Meetings and Records Law to exclude a record that is not created or maintained by a public governmental body

HB 1702 - Stevenson - Changes the laws regarding driving while intoxicated, including allowing any circuit court to establish a DWI docket to dispose of cases that stem from alcohol use

HB 1705 - Molendorp - Authorizes an alternate procedure for issuing bonds for a common sewer subdistrict in Cass County

HB 1706 - Viebrock - Removes the provision that requires fire protection districts located in Greene County to have an audit performed every two years

HB 1707 - Schaaf - Allows all third class counties to erect and maintain a jail or holding cell facility outside the county seat

HB 1712 - Roorda - Allows employees of any public body to form and join labor organizations to collectively bargain regarding salaries and other conditions of employment

HB 1716 - Curls - Changes the laws regarding unclaimed and abandoned property

HB 1717 - Schieffer - Requires counties to accept quarterly payments of real and personal property taxes

HB 1718 - Schieffer - Prohibits the sales tax on firearms or ammunition from being levied at a higher rate than for any sales tax or other excise tax charged on sporting goods or equipment or hunting equipment

HB 1724 - Sutherland - Authorizes Montgomery County to impose, upon voter approval, a transient guest tax of between 2 and 4 percent per room, per night for the promotion of tourism

HB 1727 - Zimmerman - Changes the laws regarding ethics, lobbying, and campaign contributions

HB 1728 - Zimmerman - Changes the laws regarding the use of paper ballots at elections, including requiring every individual be offered the opportunity to cast a paper ballot in state and federal elections

HB 1729 - Wallace - Changes the fee certain counties may charge for delinquent and back taxes for certain months

HB 1730 - Schieffer - Adds a circuit judge in the 45th Judicial Circuit to be elected in 2010

HB 1739 - Walsh - Changes the laws regarding fire protection districts and certain candidate qualifications in special districts and township organization counties

HB 1742 - Stevenson - Changes the laws regarding driving while intoxicated

HB 1743 - Stevenson - Changes the laws regarding driving while intoxicated

HB 1748 - Lampe - Authorizes the Clean Water Commission to designate publicly accessible bodies of water a distressed under certain circumstances and to issue cease and desist orders for certain activities

HB 1749 - Storch - Changes provisions regarding the circulation and approval of initiative petitions, including prohibiting those convicted of forgery from being petition circulators

HB 1753 - Chappelle-Nadal - Prohibits a workforce develop-

ment agency from knowingly omitting from any bidding process an entity with whom it has a contract

HB 1756 - Dethrow - Changes the laws regarding concealed carry endorsements, including lowering the age from 23 to 18 for obtaining such an endorsement and allowing those certified via military service to conceal and carry

HB 1759 - Adds the counties of Andrew and Buchanan to the list of counties authorized to enact nuisance abatement ordinances regarding the condition of real property

HB 1765 - Diehl - Requires election authorities to remove the name of any registered voter from the authority's registration records upon receipt of a written and notarized request from the voter

HB 1766 - Bivins - Repeals the Indoor Clean Air Act and enacts new provisions regarding smoking in public places

HB 1767 - Bivins - Exempts all sales of eyeglasses from state and local sales and use taxes

HB 1769 - Bivins - Requires all public governmental bodies to make and retain a verbatim audio recording of any closed meeting

HB 1770 - Bivins - Prohibits a political subdivision from imposing a fine or penalty on the owner of a pay telephone on the owner's property for calls to the emergency telephone service from the pay telephone

HB 1774 - Parson - Requires all circuit clerks in the counties of the 28th Judicial Circuit to be appointed to or removed from office by a majority of the circuit and associate judges of each county, en banc

HB 1783 - Nolte - Authorizes a motor fuel tax holiday for gasoline and diesel fuel used in a personal vehicle for a four-day period during the Memorial Day and Labor Day holiday weekends

HB 1784 - Nolte - Limits the increase in assessed valuation of

residential property by the percentage of increase in Social Security benefits for the elderly and disabled who own and live in their principal residence

HB 1787 - Jones - Changes the laws regarding defensive use of force by a property owner or lessor, lowers the age for obtaining a concealed carry endorsement, and exempts antique firearms from certain weapons offenses

HB 1788 - Parson - Changes provisions regarding initiative petitions and referendums, including prohibiting those convicted of forgery from being petition circulators

HB 1791 - LeVota - Increases from \$2 to \$4 the additional surcharge that may be assessed in a criminal case by the governing body of any county or city having a domestic violence shelter

HB 1793 - Molendorp - Authorizes a county to amend its budget to reflect any increases or decreases in revenues that could not have been estimated or anticipated when the budget was adopted

HB 1800 - Gatschenberger - Authorizes a homestead property tax exemption phased in over 15 years for certain individuals 65 years of age or older

HB 1806 - Franz - Increases the minimum assessed valuation threshold for first class counties from \$600 million to \$1 billion and from \$450 million to \$750 million for second class counties. All counties with an assessed valuation of less than \$750 million will be third class.

HB 1819 - Nolte - Exempts new vehicles assembled and sold in Missouri on or after Jan. 1, 2010, from state sales and use taxes

HB 1828 - Roorda - Modifies laws regarding driving while intoxicated, including requiring the chief governing body in every county to establish a "Sober Ride Fund" for the purpose of reimbursing licensed taxicab companies for providing rides to intoxicated persons under the provisions of Sec. 577.059, *RSMo*

HB 1829 - Walsh - Establishes the Public Employee Bargaining Act which changes the laws regarding public employee labor organizations

HB 1830 - Sutherland - Modifies provisions relating to digital cadastral parcel mapping, including establishing that the office of the state land surveyor established within the department of natural resources shall promulgate rules and regulations establishing minimum standards for digital cadastral parcel mapping

HB 1835 - Zimmerman - Allows senior citizens 62 years of age or older to defer paying property taxes on their residences under certain conditions

HB 1836 - Zimmerman - Allows any registered voter who is eligible to vote in a particular election to do so by absentee ballot without being required to state the reason

HB 1837 - Zimmerman - Revises the definition of "public governmental body" as it relates to the Open Meetings and Records Law, commonly known as the Sunshine Law, to include certain public officials and state employees

HB 1838 - Zimmerman - Prohibits elected officials of the state or any political subdivision or their staff from registering or acting as a lobbyist for one year after leaving office or employment with certain exceptions

HB 1839 - Zimmerman - Allows any registered voter who is eligible to vote in a particular election to do so by absentee ballot without being required to state a reason

HB 1842 - Wilson - Specifies that the fractional requirement for passage of a tax measure must be deemed satisfied only if the popular vote percentage is equal or greater than a four decimal percentage equivalent of the fraction

HB 1871 - Schoeller - Requires composting facilities to register with the Department of Natural Resources

HB 1881 - Grisamore - Authorizes a sales and use tax exemption for machinery, equipment, and computers used by certain data center and server farm facilities and establishes the Missouri Advantage Act

HB 1897 - Zimmerman - Authorizes political subdivisions to adopt ranked-choice voting procedures for elections

HB 1916 - Sutherland - Provides for a 2 percent deduction from the collection of taxes each year in certain counties to fund the identification and tracking of property tax abatements

HB 1917 - Wilson - Exempts horse trailers or utility trailers used solely for agricultural purposes from state and local sales and use taxes

HB 1942 - Parson - Changes requirements for the emergency telephone service 9-1-1 board in Polk County

HB 1944 - Brown - Lowers the minimum age requirement for obtaining a concealed carry endorsement from 23 years of age to 21 years of age

HB 1952 - Cox - Allows a voter to challenge another voter's registration

HB 1953 - Smith - Allows taxpayers to prepay property taxes monthly based on the previous year's tax bill

HB 1954 - Smith - Sets the maximum penalty on delinquent lands in all county except St. Louis City at 9 percent until Jan. 1, 2014

HB 1955 - Smith - Provides for installment payment of current or delinquent real property taxes over a 6-month period

HB 1959 - Schoeller - Requires records requests to be made in the office where the record was originally filed

HB 1966 - Diehl - Allows voters to cast advance ballots
